Most tourists in New York City only see Manhattan. And they don't usually see all of that. Most people don't go to Harlem, for example, because they are afraid of crime. The city also has four other boroughs: Brooklyn, the Bronx, Queens and Staten Island. The Bronx has one of the most beautiful zoos in the USA, but it also has a lot of problems. Many of the people there are poor.
